Youth Team Report - Maree Turnbull

What a blast we had experiencing Tonga in a whole new way with 10 amazing young people (aged 13-17 years) and 6 leaders!

We felt from the beginning that this vision was given to us by God - to take youth to Tonga to deepen their relationship with Him—to develop and strengthen their character, and to stretch them physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

We started preparing a couple of months before the actual trip, meeting every fortnight to learn about topics that would help everyone make their most of their time in Tonga.

On July 2nd we set out from Dunedin in the very early hours of the morning and arrived in Tonga later that afternoon. From the moment we landed until the time we arrived home, God had His hand on everything.

We had a plan of what activities we wanted to do during our short 10 day trip, but in God's timing and planning we had several CHOPs. These activities all happened at different times than we had planned due to weather or availability. But as we followed His will we experienced many gems and blessings because He was in control. He showed his faithfulness on this whole journey, from the planning stage right through to the end of making it home.

We were very warmly welcomed at the YWAM Base where we stayed, and were totally embraced as part of the Pelehake Village family. The hospitality, generosity, and love we were shown was amazing!

We managed to pack a lot into our 8 days on Tongatapu:

We spent a lot of time with the Pelehake youth, joining with all their programs. We did programs with children at Patangata and at Pelehake Primary school. We visited the Disability Resource Centre and did a program at Willie's radio station. We did community service: picking up rubbish, and visiting the elderly. We witnessed at the market, with songs and dramas. Along with all this, we found time to sightsee around the island as well as enjoying snorkeling off Pangaimotu Island, and attending the One Youth Concert. A highlight of the trip was that each youth was able to spend a day with a Tongan family in Pelehake village. All this was in addition to the daily devotion and teaching times.

By the end of the trip it was so exciting to see how everyone—both youth and leaders—had grown. This was a great taster of what a mission field looks like, as well as an introduction to the full Discipleship Training Courses.
